### **Sarah Barnett**

Before retiring to Rehoboth Beach and discovering the joys of writing creatively, Sarah Barnett had careers as teacher, librarian, and lawyer. Attending the Guild's weekly FreeWrites, she found herself writing fragments of memoir, humorous essays, and short fiction. To her surprise, some of these pieces evolved into prize-winning stories and in 2020 she received a Delaware Division of the Arts Fellowship in nonfiction. She is vice president of RBWVG and enjoys leading FreeWrites, teaching writing classes, and composing essays and stories while walking her dog on the beach. Her work has appeared in *Hippocampus*, *Brevity Blog*, *Delmarva Review*, *Delaware Beach Life*, and other publications.

### **Kim Burnett**

Kim Burnett spent her career as nonprofit marketing and communications professional. Before moving to Rehoboth, she studied creative nonfiction and personal essay at The Writer's Center in Bethesda, MD, traveled to writers' conferences, and worked with a devoted writing circle. Her work has appeared in *Persimmon Tree*, *Women on Writing*, *Delaware Beach Life*, and *IWWG Network*, and was nominated for a Pushcart Prize. She is currently working on her first novel. In 2025 she was awarded the Delaware Division of the Arts Individual Fellowship as an Emerging Writer of Fiction, Runner-Up. A memoir, *Foxes for Everybody* (Northwestern University Press) and a new poetry collection, *Dear Beast* (Saturnalia) are forthcoming in 2026. Her work has appeared in *The New York Times*, *The Best American Poetry*, *American Poetry Review*, *The Nation*, the *Pushcart Prize* anthology, and elsewhere. From 2007-2024, she was professor of English and co-director of the creative writing program at Mississippi State University. She recently moved with her family back to her home state of Delaware, where she continues to write, teach, and spend as much time outside as possible.
